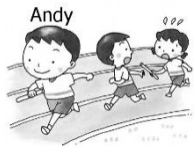
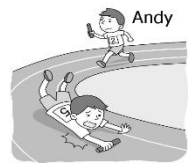

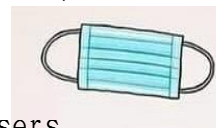

- Cheap enough to buy



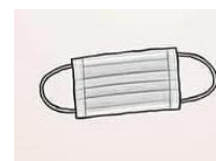
N95 Mask

- Thick filter to prevent -95% of particles sized 0.3 microns and below
- Harder to breathe in (If you find it easy to breathe in, you are wearing it wrong.)



Paper Mask

- Does not have a filter inside
- Using this to stop COVID-19 is like trying to stop your mom from beating you by breaking her stick
- Cheap enough to buy



Pitta Mask

- Usually used to keep away pollen and dust
- Not useful to stop COVID-19
- You look either super cool or super stupid



Gas Mask

- If you use this one, you are sure to be safe from everything
- A bit like bringing a big kitchen knife to cut a strawberry if you wear it to school or work in everyday lives
- People might think you are a terrorist... Or crazy... Or both.



Facial Mask

- Makes your skin soft and bright
- Makes you more popular
- Not useful at all against COVID-19
- Don't wear this out. Please.



However, besides using masks, the best advice based on CDC(衛福部疾管署) suggestions is to:

- ★Wash your hands often with soap and water and for at least 20 seconds.
- ★Stop touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands.
- ★Stay away from people who are sick as possibly as you can.

This way, you can protect yourself and others from getting sick and also help stop the sickness from spreading further.

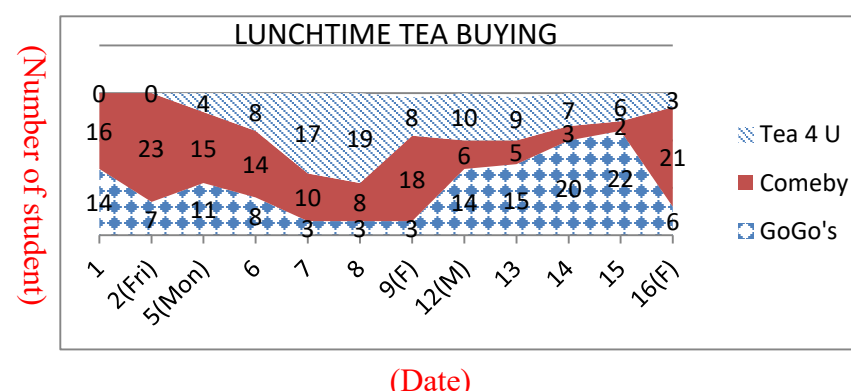

In the 1600s, British and Dutch sailors brought this fish sauce to Europe. Over time, people changed the sauce by adding tomato flavor to it, but the name basically stayed the same.

Sauna, a popular type of public steam room, comes from the Finnish language. During one of the European Olympics, sportsmen from Britain and Germany saw Finnish sportsmen used saunas after training. Later, the public all over Europe started using this style of bathing, too. Now, we still use this word to describe all kinds of steam rooms.

In India, when driving, you had better put a ring of eyeballs around your head to see what's coming. Three-wheeled rickshaws, large buses, stray dogs, bicycles and little taxis may pour in straight at you from every side.

In this world, the car horn is a tool that people can't live without when you are driving. But in Mumbai, it's gotten to be too much. People honk even when the lights are red. Honking in traffic has become such a problem, creating so much noise, that the Mumbai police came up with a plan.

At certain important crossroads, they set some devices to find horn noise. When people honked at red lights, which they often do to get other drivers ready to go, the lights stayed red. The police put up a few signs — "Honk More Wait More" — but clearly not everyone understood what was happening.

The police filmed all this, using drone shots and posted a video on social networks few weeks ago. The video shows people getting out of cars with confused looks on their faces, some shouting at each other to stop hitting the horns. "This is what we wanted to tell them: Honking or making noise doesn't move the traffic," explained Pranaya Ashok, a Mumbai police spokesman. "The traffic takes its own time to move, O.K.?"

According to an old saying in India, to drive well all you need are four simple things: a good car, good eyes, good luck and a good horn. But now, maybe you just need three.

And His Smile Stays

Remembering Robin Williams (1951 - 2014)

Have you ever noticed that big teardrop on the ever-smiling face of a clown? Doesn't that make you feel a little sad when looking at it? However, it may also best project the lives of many excellent comedians. One of them was Robin Williams.

To say that Robin Williams was a successful comedian is not enough for what he did. Although he started as a stand-up comedian, Williams later made himself as one of the most all-round actors in both Hollywood and around the world. He had won many awards with his wonderful talent for acting. No character was too difficult for him to play. For years, many actors watched his quick thinking and reaction, wondering where this **Niagara Fall of sense of humor** came from. Robin himself once thanked his mother for that, who he tried so hard to make laugh when he was young.

On August 11", 2014, the news that Robin Williams chose to end his own life shocked the world. It was later reported that Williams had in fact had problems in depression for a long time. As Jim Norton, another comedian, said, "The funniest people I know always seem to be the ones with darkness around. And that may be why they're the funniest." And humor is one way they pull themselves out of it. Like written in his obituary, "He could play anyone, but not just one: not 'just' Robin Williams. All those voices in the head of this comic Hamlet (one of his movies) must have told him it was time to be quiet. The rest is silence."
